One of the largest children's museums in the world, the Children's Museum of Indianapolis features interactive exhibits covering archeology, dinosaurs, world cultures, biotechnology and has extensive toy and dollhouse displays. Other activities include a working antique carousel and planetarium.

The Indianapolis Indians are the AAA affiliate team of Major League Baseball's Pittsburgh Pirates. The Indians play at Victory Field June 19-26 against the Rochester Red Wings (June 19-22) and the Buffalo Bisons (June 23-26.)

Built in 1909, this is one of the most celebrated auto raceways in the world. The 2.5-mile course hosts the Indianapolis 500, the United States Grand Prix and the NASCAR Brickyard 400. The Speedway's Hall of Fame and Museum are located within the track.

Other collections at the museum include African art, Japanese Edo-period paintings and American furniture, textiles and costumes. The museum's contemporary art collection includes Robert Indiana's famous LOVE.

### Full Registration
